Suchetna (Bareilly Diocesan Social Service Centre) is a registered charitable society, registered under Society Registration Act 1860, since 1989. It has roots in 3 districts of Uttar Pradesh namely, Bareilly, Pilibhit, and Shahjahanpur and in 6 districts Uttarakhand namely Almora, Bageshwar, Champawat, Nainital, Pithoragarh and Udham Singh Nagar. It has spread its social development activities in 791 villages, of 39 blocks and 19 Nagar Panchayats, through 20 sub-centers in the diocese. Suchetna intervenes in the issues of the target groups (Children, Adolescent Girls, Youth, Women, Men, Farmers, rag pickers and Children and Youngsters with Disability) and brings about social, economic, educational, political and behavioral changes among them.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

Throughout the year, women were encouraged to rise with dignity, confidence, and self-reliance. Regular awareness programs, IGPs, Government schemes, SHG capacity-building, herbal medicines, and entrepreneurship sessions were conducted. Women took active part in financial literacy sessions, digital learning, exposure visits, and vocational skill trainings such as tailoring, marketing skills, crafts, and micro-enterprise development.

Impact:

Women began to believe in their potential and took bold steps toward





SHG Women Spread Sanitation Awareness Through Street Play

On June 18, twelve SHG women in Pakoda village planned a sanitation street play. Initially hesitant, they gained confidence with support from Suchetna staff. Led by Sangeeta Devi, the group prepared a play on menstrual hygiene, cleanliness, and the environment.

On June 22 at Gandhi Chowk, they performed before a large crowd and received praise from local officials. The event empowered the women and highlighted the strength of SHGs in bringing social change.



Women Bring Light to Juasthaganja

Juasthaganja village suffered constant power cuts due to having only one transformer. On 16 March 2025, 15 women of the New Disha Group took action. After their first application brought no response, they boldly approached the District Magistrate on 23 May 2025.

Moved by their unity, the DM approved a new transformer.

With support from Suchetna, BDSSC, and animator Leela, the women proved how collective action can transform a community.





Kishori (Adolescent Girls) Empowerment

Adolescent girls are the future pillars of change. Through life-skills education, self-defence training, leadership, personality development, behaviour modification, gender, yoga, safe environment, and menstrual health programs, the girls learned to value themselves and their dignity. Sessions on early marriage prevention, cyber-safety, digital literacy, and career guidance motivated them to pursue their dreams confidently.

Impart:

Girls developed self-respect, clarity of thought, and courage to challenge gender-based discrimination and early marriage pressures. Their confidence grew as they began to voice opinions, participate in group discussions, and set academic and vocational goals. Improved hygiene habits, leadership skills, and aspirations for higher education marked a remarkable shift in their mindset.





A Ray of Hope for Sundasi's Girls

Sundasi village in Izatnagar faces deep poverty, forcing many adolescent girls to leave school. In 2024, BDSSC formed Adolescent Girls Groups, where the girls expressed a desire to learn tailoring to rebuild their future. In January 2025, BDSSC started a four-month tailoring course. Fifteen girls joined and learned to stitch garments while gaining confidence and independence. After completing the training, twelve girls began taking stitching orders from nearby villages. A simple opportunity has opened the door to dignity, income, and new hope for Sundasi's young girls



Unnati: A Ray of Hope in Palpur

In Palpur village, where poverty forces many girls out of school, BDSSC formed the Unnati Adolescent Girls Group. During a meeting in May 2025, members learned that Usha was severely ill and unable to get treatment. The girls visited her home, rushed her for tests, and doctors confirmed **Tuberculosis**. From that day, the Unnati group stood by her—ensuring daily medicines, supporting her family, and helping her receive nutritional kits. With their care, Usha regained her strength and confidence.

“My friends saved my life,” she says.

Child Parliament

Child Parliament platforms nurtured leadership and democratic values among children. Through structured meetings, trainings, discussions, and awareness sessions on child rights, leadership, behaviour modification, personality development, safe environment, moral values, hygiene, responsibility, and academic discipline, children learned to express themselves respectfully and act responsibly.

Impact:

Children became more disciplined, confident, and socially aware. They took initiative in school cleanliness, peer support, and attendance improvement drives. The sense of accountability and teamwork encouraged them to dream big and become responsible future citizens.





Farmer's Entitlement

BDSSC is thrilled to work with Farmers. Farmers were formed into groups and oriented on organic farming, government schemes, sustainable agriculture techniques, organic pest management, water conservation, and kitchen gardening. Exposure visits and agricultural advisory meetings helped them adopt progressive farming practices.

Impact:

Farmers accessed government benefits, enhanced soil management practices, and began organic vegetable cultivation at home. Kitchen gardens improved nutritional intake and reduced expenses. Increased confidence encouraged farmers to interact with government officials and actively participate in agricultural committees





Specially Abled Youngsters and Children

A total of 255 Special children across the Bareilly diocese were nurtured with love, patience, and continuous support. Physio-therapy services, inclusive education support, home-based interventions, and family counselling strengthened their abilities and dignity. 60% of the received disability cards, various devices from the Child welfare department.

Impact:

Children showed significant improvements in mobility, communication, social interaction, and daily-living skills. Families gained emotional strength and acceptance. With improved confidence, children participated in group activities and gatherings, proving that ability shines brighter than disability.





Rag-Picking Girls and Children

Educational support, classes, nutrition and hygiene awareness, recreational activities were and skill training provided to children and girls from rag-picker families. Meeting, Counselling and sensitization sessions motivated adolescent girls and their parents to prioritize education over labour and for healthy living.

Impact:

Adolescent girls and Children began to maintain cleanliness, attend school regularly, and focus on studies. Many left rag-picking activities and started envisioning a hopeful future. Parents reported positive change in children's behaviour, discipline, and health.





Community Health

Health awareness campaigns on personal hygiene, menstrual health, nutrition, and preventive care were conducted. Medical camps, health exhibitions, anaemia prevention sessions, and counselling were given to all the target groups.

Impact:

Women and girls adopted healthy hygiene practices, sought timely medical care, and improved nutrition. Communities demonstrated cleaner surroundings and better understanding of health rights and responsibilities.





Income Generation Programs

Women, adolescent girls, farmers and parents of specially-abled children were trained in tailoring, beautician work, soap, detergent powder and phenyl production, candle-making, mushroom cultivation, incense making, food processing, nutrition garden and handicrafts.

Impact:

Trained target groups initiated home-based enterprises and small businesses, leading to enhanced household income, financial discipline, and self-confidence. Families became more self-reliant, and women emerged as economic contributors.




Safe Environment

BDSSC consistently worked towards promoting a clean and healthy environment by organizing various awareness and action-based activities throughout the year. Environmental awareness sessions, cleanliness drives, waste segregation campaigns, and tree plantation programs were conducted in different villages to instil ecological consciousness among women, men, adolescent girls (AGs), child parliaments (CPs), and Village Development Committees (VDCs).

Through these initiatives, target groups were encouraged to understand the importance of protecting nature, reducing waste, and maintaining hygiene in their surroundings. Practical demonstrations and community participation made the activities more effective and impactful.

Impact:

The villages witnessed visible improvement in cleanliness and greenery, and community members adopted responsible waste management practices. Children and youth became enthusiastic promoters of environmental protection, spreading the message of eco-friendly living and developing a culture of sustainability within their communities.





Village Development Committee (VDC)

VDC members were motivated to have regular meeting and trained in leadership, community planning, government linkages, and monitoring and evaluating of village development issues and programs.

Impact:

Communities strengthened their participation in governance. Better access to entitlements, collective actions, and village-level decision-making fostered self-reliance and accountability.





Important Events & Celebrations

Our BDSSC target groups actively celebrated International Women’s Day, Children’s Day, Disability Day, Girl child day, Environment Day, Health days, and festivals through rallies, cultural programs, competitions, and awareness campaigns.

Impact:

These events fostered unity, cultural pride, awareness on social issues, and recognition of talents among all age groups.





Exposure Visits

Adolescent girls and Children visited model institutions such as police stations, banks, post offices, vocational centers, and successful SHGs to understand systems, services, and opportunities.

Impact:

Exposure strengthened knowledge, motivation, and confidence. Beneficiaries returned inspired to implement new practices and dream beyond limitations





Planning, Monitoring & Evaluation (PME)

BDSSC, Suchetna strongly believes in fostering and conducting PME (planning, monitoring, evaluating) at the local, zonal as well as center level to provide more comprehensive information on efficiency, relevance, sustainability, impact and effectiveness of work in progress. Bi-monthly PME is organized at the local level and Quarterly PME twice at the Zonal level and twice at the Centre level with the Director, women coordinator. This not only helps the staff in learning but also gives us the means to evaluate our progress and plan according to the objectives of the Project.

Impact:

As a result all the BDSSC programs and trainings ran smoothly with improved transparency, effectiveness, and timely support for community needs.





Care and Support for Senior Citizens by Adolescent Girls

As part of nurturing responsibility, empathy, and social sensitivity, adolescent girls were encouraged to extend care and support to senior citizens in their communities. With gentle guidance, they regularly visited elderly persons—especially those living alone or facing health challenges. The girls offered emotional support through conversations, shared moments of prayer and companionship, assisted with small household tasks, read letters or books for them, and helped maintain cleanliness around their homes. They also reminded elders about medicine schedules, cleanliness, hydration, and healthy habits. Festivals and special days were celebrated with them to ensure no elder felt forgotten.

Impact:

. Senior citizens felt loved, cared for, and emotionally uplifted. Their loneliness reduced as they experienced dignity and warmth in being valued by the younger generation. The girls developed a strong sense of social responsibility, empathy, and personal growth, committing themselves to caring for the vulnerable in society.





Vastra Seva – Clothing Support for the Poor and Needy

As part of our ongoing commitment to serve the marginalized communities, the Vastra Seva program was organized to provide clothing to the poor and needy families living in and around the villages of Haldwani and Kathgodam. This initiative ensured that individuals from economically disadvantaged backgrounds received clean, good-quality clothes, helping them live with dignity and comfort.

The clothes distributed through this program were generously donated by various schools, institutions, and kind-hearted individuals, reflecting a strong spirit of compassion and social responsibility. These contributions enabled us to reach a large number of beneficiaries, including women, men, children, elderly persons, and daily wage laborers.

Through this service, many vulnerable families managed to secure essential clothing for daily use and seasonal needs, reducing their financial burden and improving their quality of life. The initiative not only supported poor communities but also encouraged a culture of sharing and generosity within society.

The Vastra Seva program stands as a testimony to collective kindness, and we remain grateful to all donors and supporters who made this noble mission possible. Together, we continue to bring warmth, hope, and dignity to those in need.
